

Froot Loop Necklaces

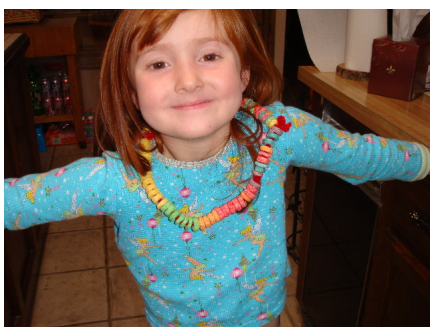
